# **Operating Principles**

## Age

Turning 14 in 2020\*

Until your 25th birthday to complete

## **Structure**

4 required sections: Service, Skill, Physical Recreation, Adventurous Journeys (the hike). At Gold undertake a 5-day Residential Project away from home.

## Levels

3 levels of Award: Bronze (for those aged 14 or over), Silver (for those aged 15 or over) and Gold (for those aged 16 or over)

## **Minimum Time**

6 months for Bronze, 12 months for Silver and 18 months for a Gold Award.





## **AWARD FRAMEWORK**

The Gold Residential Project, completed only at Gold level, aims to broaden participants' horizons through involvement with others in a residential setting.



## **ASSESSORS**

- suitably skilled, qualified and/or experienced adults (approved by an Award Centre)
- assist Participants to set suitable goals
- help Participants to develop a program, stay focused and encourage/recognise improvement (mentoring)
- record positive comments and give final signoff (via paper form or email)

Assessors should not be family members





- Must provide their Working With Children (WWC) number via the Google form.
- Consider asking a suitable teacher to be your assessor







### Assessor Commencement Guide (ACG)

#### The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award – Australia (NSW Division)

Assessors Assessors are Volunteers# who assist young people with their Duke of Edinburgh's

International Award (Duke of Ed). A Participant will need at least one Assessor for each Section

of their Duke of Ed to help guide them through that Section.

Award Leaders Adults appointed by an Award Unit (organisation delivering The Duke of Ed) who are

responsible for running The Duke of Ed in that organisation.

Participants Young people registered to participate in the Bronze, Silver or Gold level of The Duke of Ed.

If your Assessor has not already been approved by your Award Leader please complete the *Participant Details* table below and give this **Guide** to your intended Assessor. Please also remember to give them a sealable envelope to maintain the privacy of their completed *Volunteer Details and Agreements* (last page of this **Guide**). Return the completed *Volunteer Details and Agreements* to your Award Leader.

REMEMBER:

You can ONLY commence a Duke of Ed Section activity AFTER your Award Leader has approved your Assessor for that Section.

If you change any of your Assessors you MUST inform your Award Leader.

Note: Award Participants are expected to comply with all relevant / respective safety requirements and procedures and not to act in any way to jeopardise the safety of themselves or others within the activity environment.



# Bronze Qualifying Hikes - 2 days, 1 night

Option 1: Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> – Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> October

Option 2: Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> – Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> October

\* Option 3: Saturday 31st October – Sunday 1st November

# **FAQs**



#### Can I take a break during my Award?

Yes, you can take a break in any of your activities if you need to. Remember, you will need to make up for the time you have missed during the break. For example, if you have completed two months of a six month Section, and you have a one month break because of exams, you just need to complete the remaining four months after your exams.

#### Can I change activities if I need to?

Yes, changing activities is fine when circumstances are beyond your control (eg due to a change of seasonal sport). Remember, you may also have a new Assessor and your Award Leader will first have to approve them before you start the new activity.

#### Do school or work activities count?

Award activities should be done substantially in your own free time. You should not be paid for any activities that you will count towards your Duke of Ed.

#### Can I do my Award in conjunction with Scouts / Surf Life Saving / Cadets etc...?

Yes, if you are already involved with an organisation you can count the activities you do with them towards your Duke of Ed.

#### Can I count any activities I was involved with prior to starting my Duke of Ed?

You can only count activities after your Award Leader has accepted you as a Participant.
