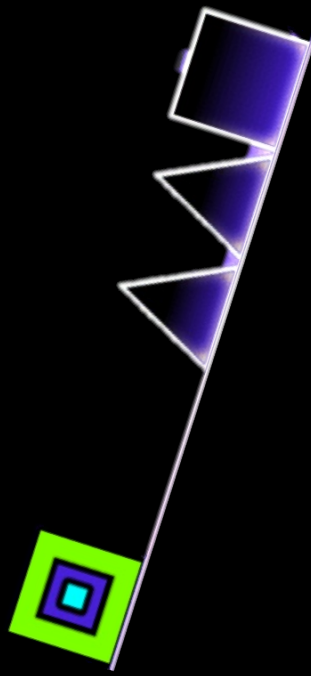

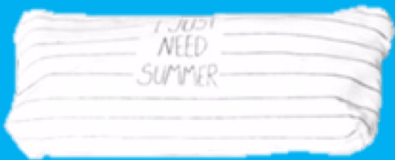

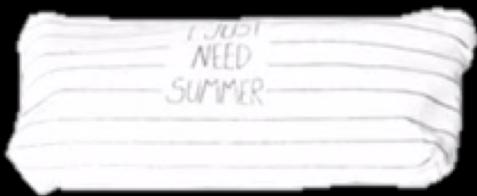
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BURRITO CASE STOLEN

An outsider, Sam Doughty, says **"The girls have really pushed through this together."**

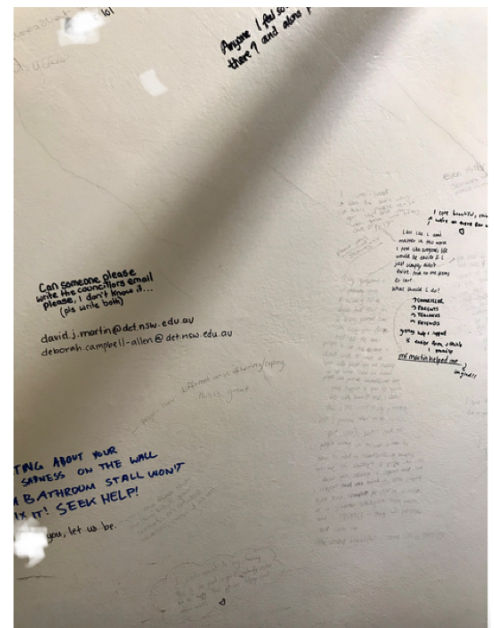
Zali says **"The community is so helpful and heartwarming in the way of helping others in need even though they have no idea who they help and how much they help them."**

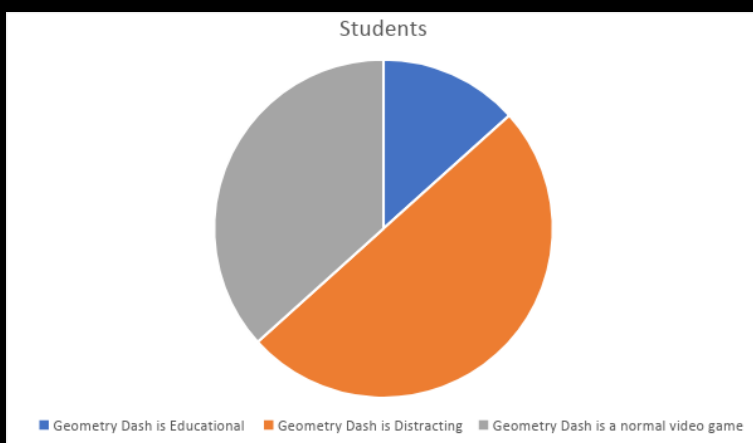


A BLESSING OR A CURSE?

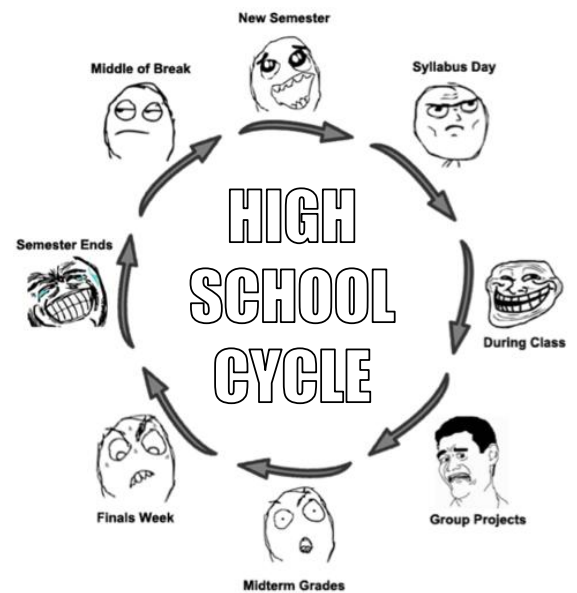

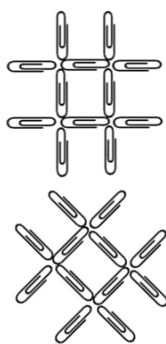


